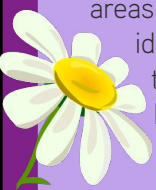


INAUGURAL INSET

EXECUTIVE BOARD

Headteachers from each of our five Trust Schools meet fortnightly with Rebecca Plaskitt, Chief Executive Officer and Paula Chowdhury, Director of Finance & Operations, to discuss strategic issues and further development opportunities. Some of the issues that the Executive Board has focused on recently, include:

- Development of the Hamsey Green Primary School lower site, including the feasibility of offering nursery provision in the near future
- Creating a common IT platform across all schools to enhance collaboration and communication
- Providing greater opportunities for training and extending professional development programmes for all staff and Governors
- Creating a Maths transition programme for pupils in Years 5-8
- Further development of Reading for enjoyment across all schools
- Considering options for extended use of school facilities and the development of partnerships within the local community
